Class of 1963 Distinguished Lecturer (Keynote) - Dr. Mike Bunning



Dr. Mike Bunning

Alumnus, Dr. Mike Bunning will serve as the OSU CVM Class of 1963 Distinguished Lecturer at Fall Conference.

The keynote will take place on Thursday, November 3, at 8 AM. His presentation is titled: "Veterinary Career - The Long and Winding Road."

Dr. Bunning, MPH, MS, and CVM class of 1980 alumnus, is a retired United States Air Force Public Health Officer, full Colonel.

More About Dr. Bunning

Dr. Bunning's service included leading the Provincial Reconstruction Team - Baghdad (PRTB) health team, integrating all health activities for the Office of Provincial Affairs, United States Embassy in Baghdad, Iraq. He was responsible for coordinating with the Iraqi Ministries of Health, Education, and Higher Education. He led public health initiatives within the Strategic Framework Agreement having a pivotal role in the development and sustainment of Iraq's fledgling democracy.

He served on the forefront of the West Nile Virus response as the virus spread in 2002, 03, 04 and was later involved in the anthrax letter attacks. He finished his USAF career as the hospital administrator for coalition forces in Basra, Iraq. His expertise covers the entire spectrum of One Health, intersecting nearly every segment of veterinary employment.

Dr. Bunning began his veterinary career as a mixed animal/dairy veterinarian and was a practice owner in western Oklahoma. He served as the Center for Disease Control Epidemic Intelligence Service officer, covering Nipah virus following an outbreak of disease in pigs and people in Malaysia and Singapore. Dr. Bunning is currently in private practice as a clinical ER veterinarian in San Antonio.
